WHY WAS SAUL DISOBEDIENT?
1. ISOLATION: "When I saw that the people were scattered from me" (1 Samuel 13:11b).
2. IMPATIENCE: "and that you did not come within the days appointed" (1 Samuel 11:13c).

3. FEAR: "and that the Philistines gathered together at Michmash"

(1 Samuel 13:11d).

SAUL DISOBEYS AGAIN

⁸ He also took Agag king of the Amalekites alive, and utterly destroyed all the people with the edge of the sword.

⁹ But Saul and the people spared Agag and the best of the sheep, the oxen, the fatlings, the lambs, and all that was good, and were unwilling to utterly destroy them. But everything despised and worthless, that they utterly destroyed.

3. SAUL'S FEAR OF MAN

²¹ But the people took of the plunder, sheep and oxen, the best of the things which should have been utterly destroyed, to sacrifice to the LORD your God in Gilgal." ²² So Samuel said: "Has the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, As in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, And to heed than the fat of rams.

3. SAUL'S FEAR OF MAN

²³ For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, And stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry. Because you have rejected the word of the LORD, He also has rejected you from being king." ²⁴ Then Saul said to Samuel, "I have sinned, for I have transgressed the commandment of the LORD and your words, because I feared the people and obeyed their voice.

HOW DOES JESUS HELP US OBEY?

Pride -> Humility (Philippians 2:8).
 Greed -> Contentment (1 Timothy 6:6-10).
 Fear of man -> Fear of God (Proverbs 22:4).

4. Isolation/rejection -> Community.
5. Impatience -> Patience (fruit of the Spirit).
6. Fear of death/failure -> Faith.

JESUS LEARNED OBEDIENCE
