And the LORD said to Gideon, "Everyone who laps from the water with his tongue, as a dog laps, you shall set apart by himself; likewise everyone who gets down on his knees to drink." ⁶ And the number of those who lapped, putting their hand to their mouth, was three hundred men;

⁸ So the people took provisions and their trumpets in their hands. And he sent away all the rest of Israel, every man to his tent, and retained those three hundred men. Now the camp of Midian was below him in the valley.

WHAT WAS GOD LOOKING FOR?

An army with a culture of HUMILITY (living for God's glory) instead of haughtiness (living for self).

God's kingdom is about:

- 1. A choice to be made (FAITH or fear).
- 2. A test to be passed (SURRENDER or selfishness).

The same applies to relationships in His kingdom.

WHAT IS GOD LOOKING FOR IN OUR CHURCH?

- K = KING as the head and focus
- F = FAITH in our King and trusting one another.
- A = ACCOUNTABILITY through transparency.
- M = MUTUAL encouragement and celebration.
- I = INCLUSIVITY and invitation.
- L = LAYING down of self.
- Y = YOU above me.

PERFECT LOVE MAKES US A KINGDOM FAMILY

- ¹² No one has seen God at any time. If we love one another, God abides in us, and His love has been perfected in us.
