bārak (בָרַך)

To bless in the OT means "to endue with power for success, prosperity, fecundity, longevity, etc." It is frequently contrasted with qālal "to esteem lightly, curse" (cf. Deut 30:1, 19).

Numbers 6:25-26 (NIV)

²⁵the Lord make his **face** shine on you and be gracious to you; ²⁶the Lord turn his **face** toward you and give you peace." '

Exodus 33.20 (NIV)

Exodus 33:20 (NIV): $^{20}\mbox{But,}^{\prime\prime}$ he said, "you cannot see my face, for no one may see me and live."



Genesis 27.10-13 (NIV)

 $^{10}\mbox{Then}$ take it to your father to eat, so that he may give you his blessing before he dies."

¹¹Jacob said to Rebekah his mother, "But my brother Esau is a hairy man while I have smooth skin. ¹²What if my father touches me? I would appear to be tricking him and would bring down a curse on myself rather than a blessing."

 $^{13}\mathrm{His}$ mother said to him, "My son, let the curse fall on me. Just do what I say; go and get them for me."
