

DAILY DEVOTIONALS FROM JAMES 1:2-8

These daily devotionals can be used as family discussions, including the children, or in groups of two or three.

Monday 30 March

Read James 1:2

- What does it mean for you to have joy?
- How can this current “trial” cause joy to increase in your life?
- Read the following additional scriptures: Psalm 16:11, Nehemiah 8:10.
- Pray for each other to grow in the joy of the Lord.

Tuesday 31 March 2020

Read James 1:3

- How are you being tested in your faith right now?
- What areas in your life are not leading to patience/endurance/longsuffering?
- Read the following additional scriptures: Romans 5:1-5, 1 Peter 1:7.
- Pray for each other to allow endurance to be formed in this time.

Wednesday 1 April 2020

Read James 1:4

- Share about the most testing time in your life and what you learned in it.
- What does it mean to be “perfect and complete”?
- Read the following additional scriptures: Ephesians 4:11-16, Colossians 1:28.
- Pray for each other to keep growing to maturity in Christ.

Thursday 2 April 2020

Read James 1:5

- Where do you need wisdom in your current situation?
- How can you position yourself to receive God’s wisdom?
- Read the following additional scriptures: Proverbs 9:10, Colossians 1:9.
- Pray for each other and ask God for His wisdom in this time.

Friday 3 April 2020

Read James 1:6

- Describe a time in your life where you doubted God's provision/breakthrough.
- What causes doubt to manifest in your life?
- Read the following additional scriptures: Ephesians 4:14, 1 Timothy 2:8.
- Pray for each other and ask Jesus to increase your faith so that doubt and fear will decrease.

Saturday 4 April 2020

Read James 1:7-8

- What prevents you from receiving from the Lord?
- Describe a time when you have been double-minded and unstable.
- Read the following additional scriptures: Psalm 24:3-5, James 4:8.
- Pray and confess to Jesus where there is still double-mindedness, instability and fear in your life, and ask Him to deliver you.

For additional study, read the whole of James 1 to get a better understanding of applying these scriptures to our daily lives for the sake of others.
