



What does the word sanctification mean to me?

Word definition

More than mere moral reformation of character, work of Holy Spirit bringing the whole nature more and more under the influence of the new gracious principles implanted in the soul in regeneration.

Being made holy, set aside, purified, also used in relation to other words like regeneration, justification and glorification.

1) Sanctification has a definite beginning at regeneration.

(Titus 3:5; 1 John 3:9; 1 Cor.6:11; Acts 20:32; Rom. 6:11-18)

<u>Titus 3:5 - 5</u> he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit. <u>1 John 3:9 - 9</u> No one born of God makes a practice of sinning, for God's seed abides in him; and he cannot keep on sinning, because he has been born of God.

2) Sanctification increases throughout life.

(Rom. 6:12-13; Rom. 6:19; 2 Cor. 3:18: Phil.3:13-14; Col. 3:10; Heb. 12:14; James 1:22)

<u>Romans 6:12-13 - 12</u> Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, to make you obey its passions. 13 Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness.

3) Sanctification is completed at death (for our souls) and when the Lord returns (for our bodies).

(Heb. 12:23; 2 Cor. 7:1; 1 Thess. 5:23; 1 Cor. 15:49)

<u>1 Thess 5:23</u> Now may the God of peace himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

4) Sanctification is never completed in this life.

(Matt. 5:48; 2 Cor. 7:1; 1Thess. 5:23; 1 John 3:6)

<u>2 Cor 7:1</u> Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit, bringing holiness to completion in the fear of God.

Heart Check...

God and man cooperate in Sanctification

1) God's role in sanctification is *primary*.

(1 Thess. 5:23; Heb. 12:5-11; 1 Cor. 1:30; Heb. 12:2; 1 Peter 2:21; 1 John 2:6; 1 Peter 1:2; Gal. 5:22-23)

2) Our role in sanctification is *both passive* (yielding, surrender) *and active* (bring myself to Him); and it is *secondary*.

(Rom 6:13, 8:13, 12:1; Phil. 2:12-13; Heb. 10:24-25)

Sanctification affects the whole person

intellect: Col. 3:10; Rom. 12:1-2; Col. 1:10; 2 Cor. 10:5; emotions: Gal. 5:22; 1 Peter 2:11; 1 John 2:15; Rom. 6:17; will: Phil. 2:13; spirit: 2 Cor. 7:1; 1 Cor. 7:34; physical bodies: 1 Thess. 5:23; 2 Cor. 7:1; Rom. 6:12; 1 Cor. 6:13, 19-20
