


Galatians 2:20

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.




Philippians 3:13-14

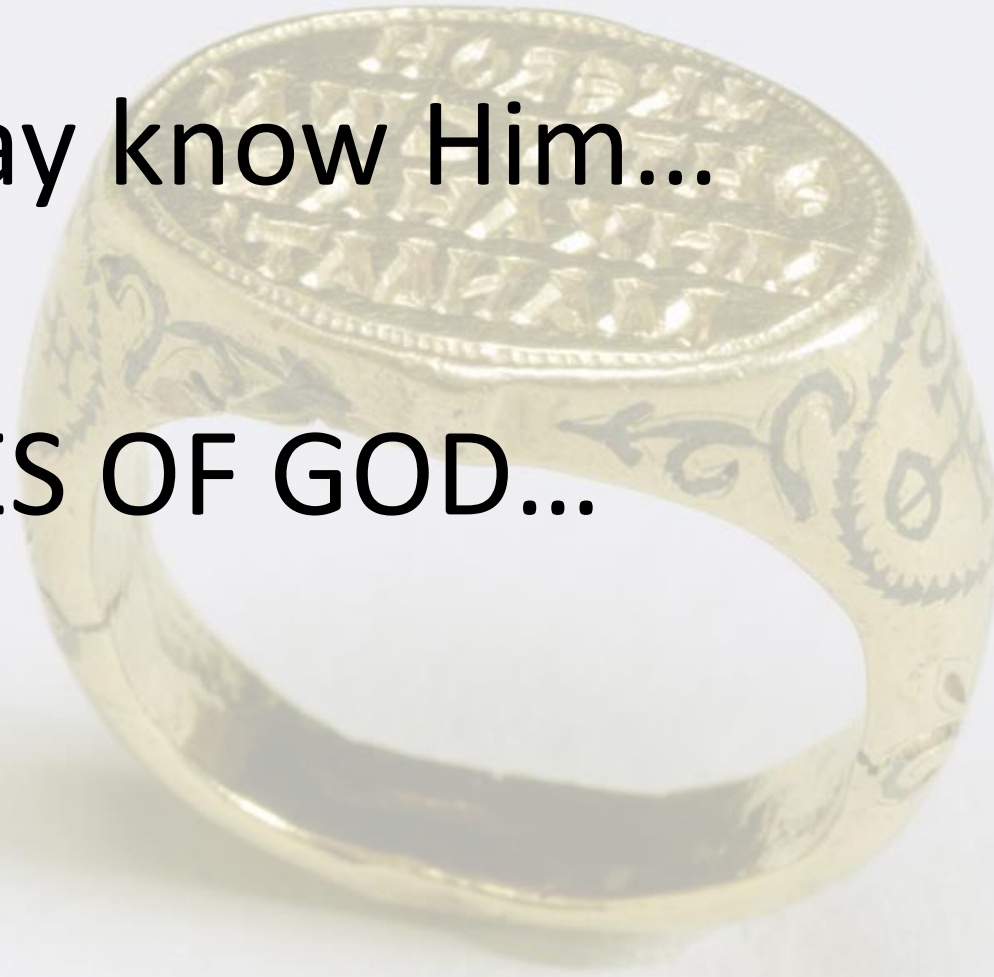

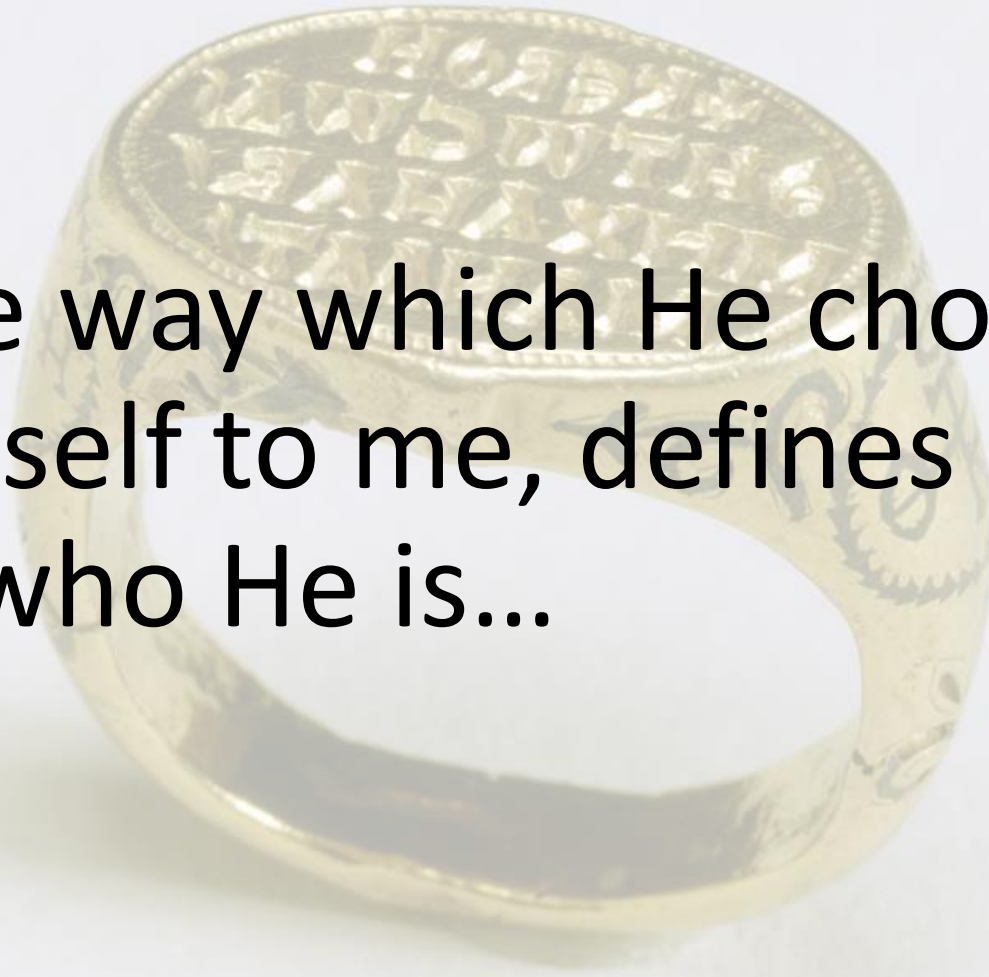

The unique way which He chooses to reveal Himself to me, defines my identity in light of who He is...



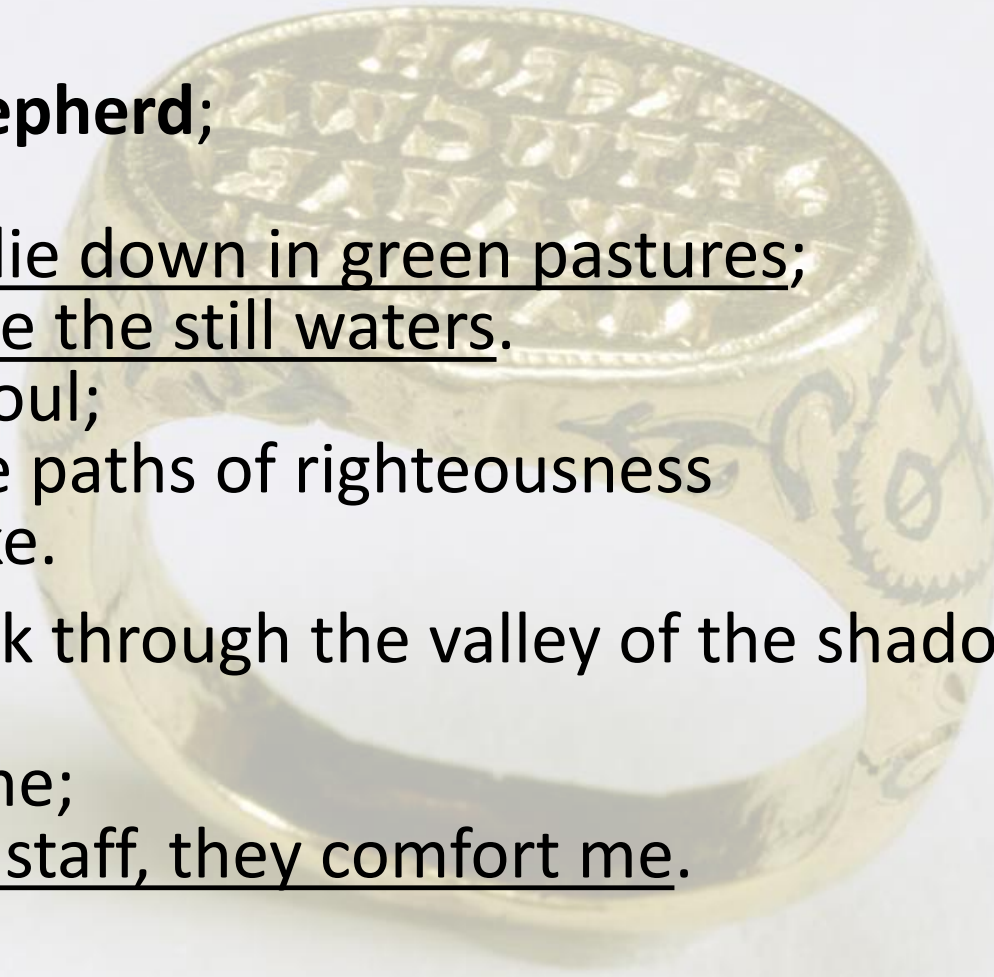
1. The Shepherd (Psalm 23)

He leads me beside the still waters.

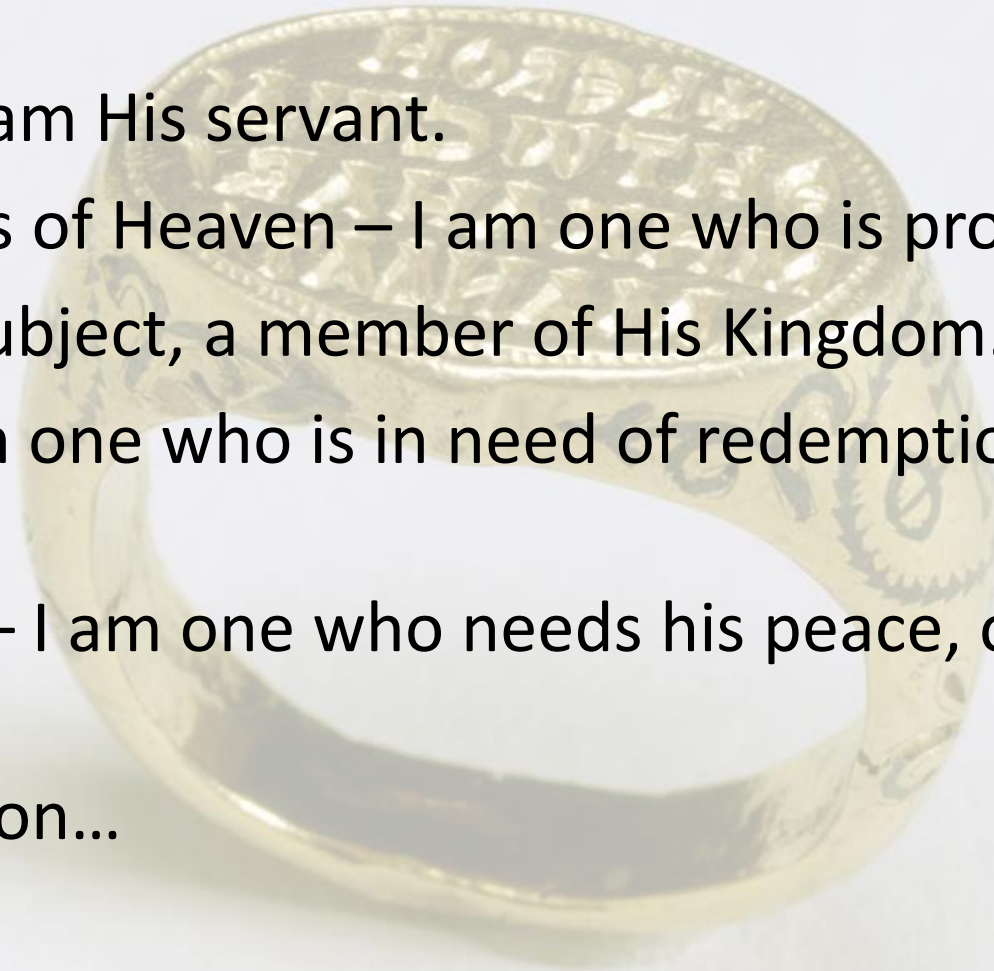
³ He restores my soul;


ADOPTION!

Romans 8: 14-17


The Model of Adoption: Patria Potestas

Patria potestas, (Latin: “power of a father”), in Roman family law, power that the male head of a family exercised over his children and his more remote descendants in the male line, whatever their age, as well as over those brought into the family by adoption.



The Model of Adoption: Mancipatio

Mancipatio is a legal formality prescribed by the Roman classic law by which a property is transferred either by an actual or a simulated purchase, or a formal conveyance in the guise of a sale.



Emancipation

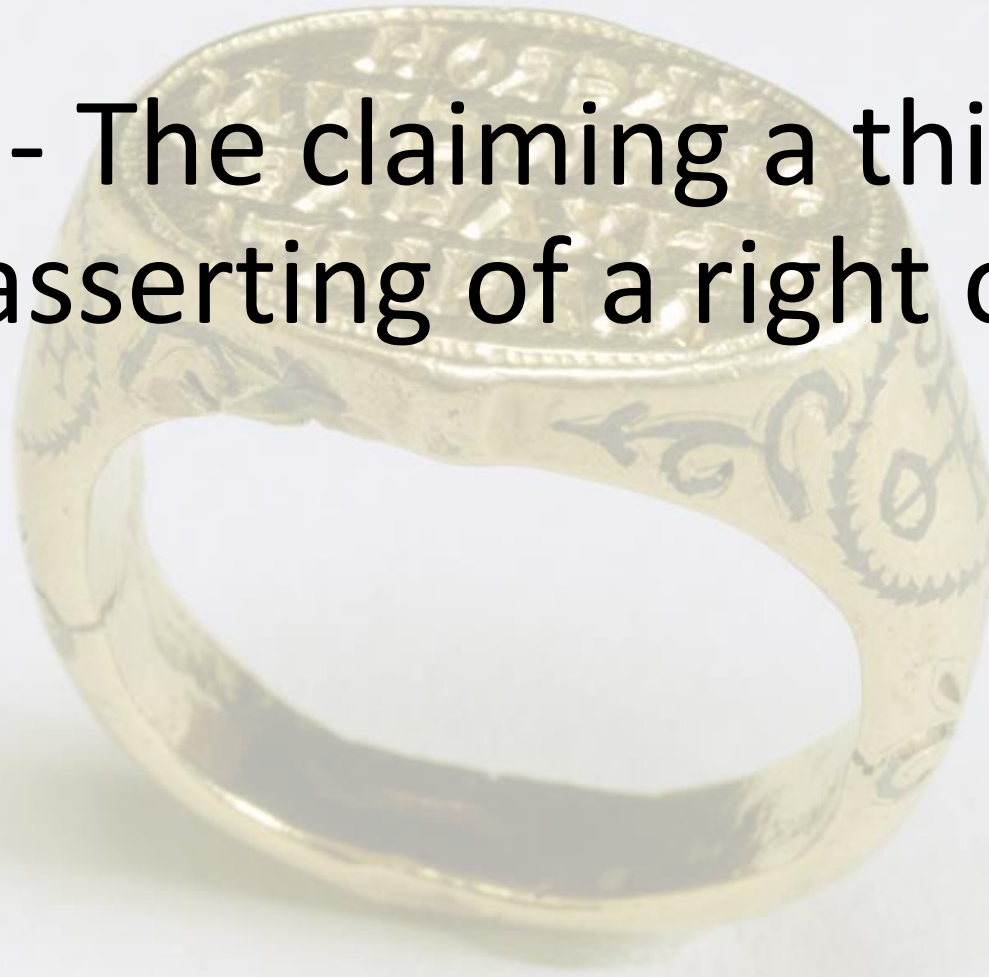
Emancipation - of minors is a legal mechanism by which a minor is freed from control by their parents or guardians, and the parents or guardians are freed from any and all responsibility toward the child.

Emancipation - the fact or process of being set free from legal, social, or political restrictions; liberation.


The freeing of someone from slavery.

The Model of Adoption: Vindicatio

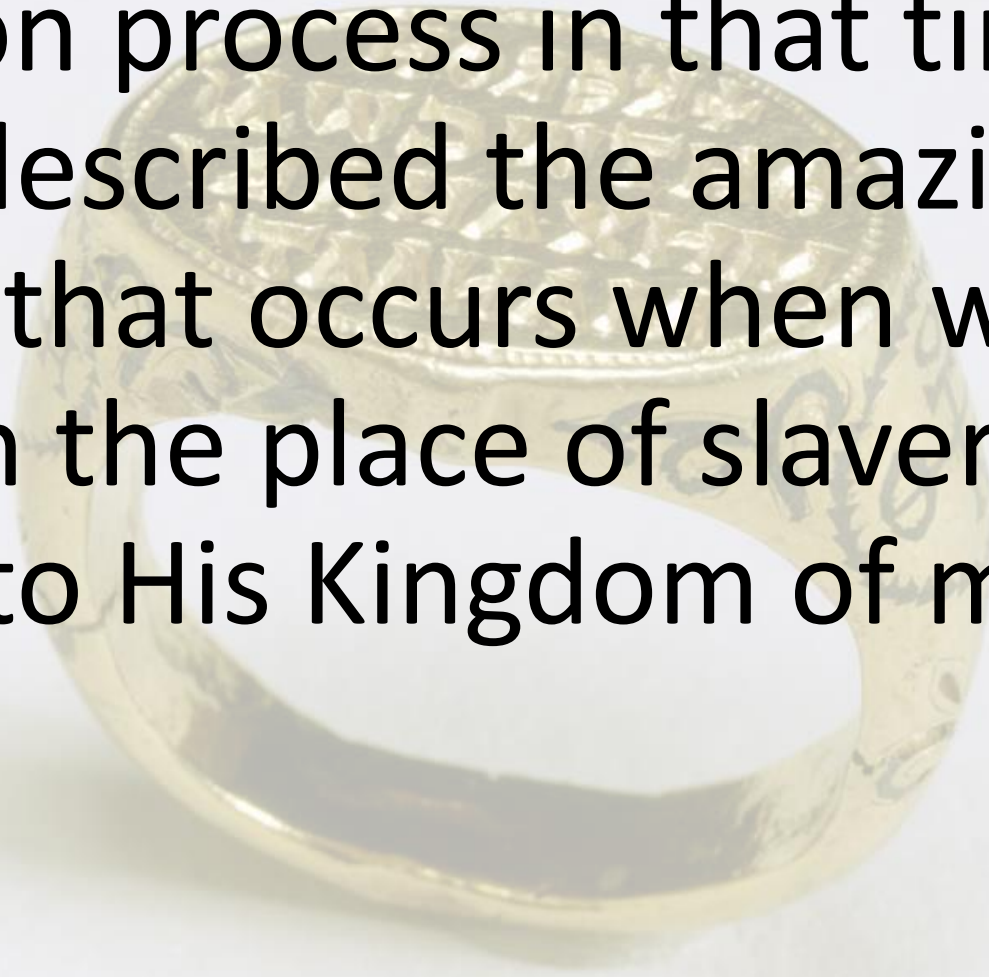
Vindicatio - The claiming a thing as one's own ; the asserting of a right or title in or to a thing.



What Adoption Meant:

1. Give up all rights in the old family; Gain all rights in the new family.
 2. Become an heir to your new father's estate.
 3. Old life was erased/obliterated from record. Debts and records erased. It was as if you never existed, and have only now been born.
 4. Permanently and absolutely, you became the son of the new father.
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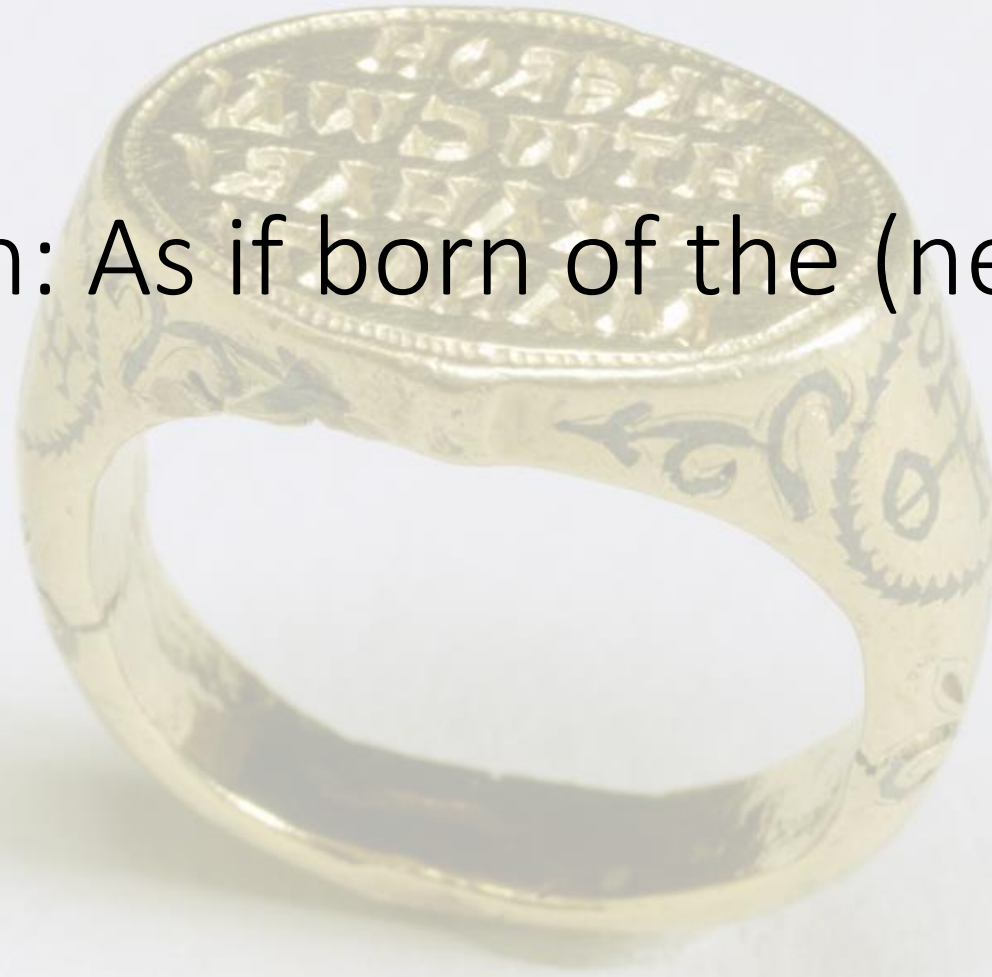
The adoption process in that time accurately described the amazing transaction that occurs when we are moved from the place of slavery and darkness into His Kingdom of marvellous light!

Adoption: As if born of the (new) Father



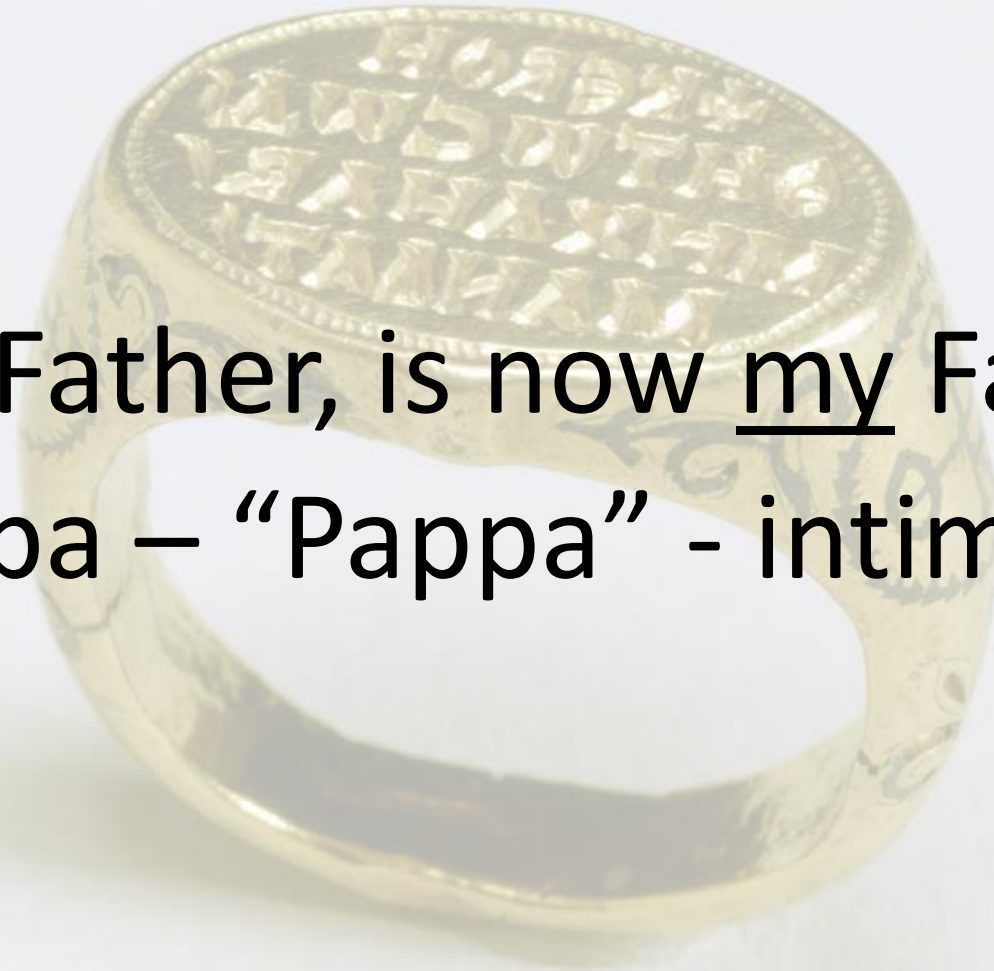
The Spirit of Adoption: Romans 8

“Abba Father”

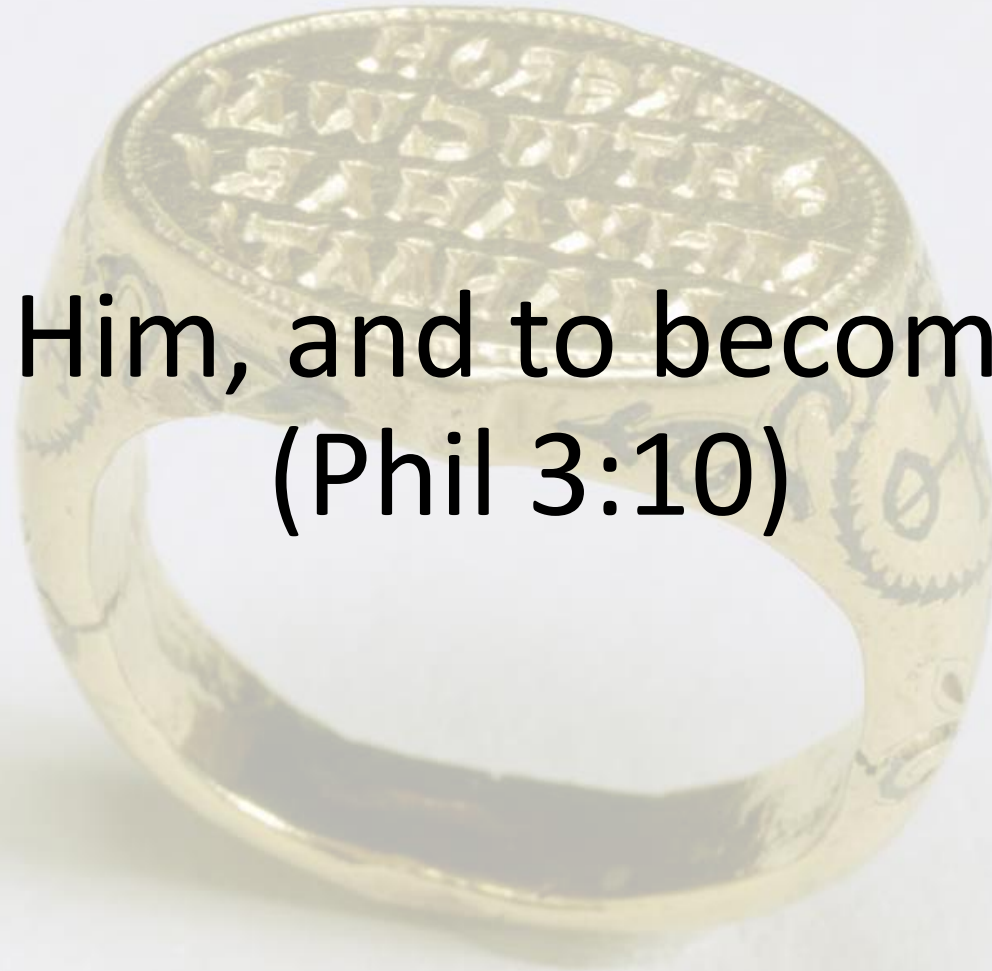
- The Father, is now my Father



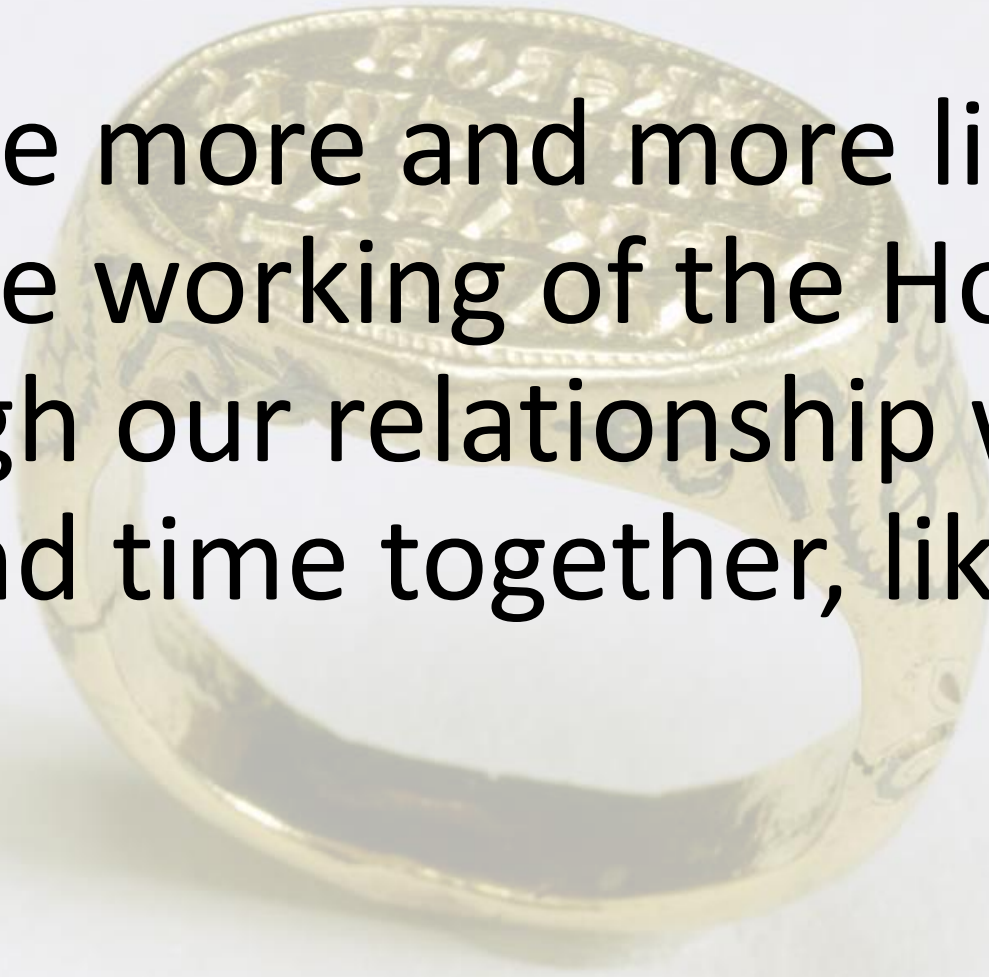
