

BETHEL

• **Genesis 28:19**

• He named that place **Bethel** (which means "house of God"), although it was previously called Luz.

• **Genesis 31:13**

I am the God who appeared to you at Bethel, the place where you
anointed the pillar of stone and made your vow to me. Now get ready
and leave this country and return to the land of your birth."

Genesis 35:15

And Jacob named the place Bethel (which means "house of God"),
 because God had spoken to him there.

BETHEL

A few years later the prophet <u>Hosea</u> (8th century BC) speaks (at least according to modern translations) of the "wickedness" of Bethel (<u>Hosea 10:15</u>) and <u>Jeremiah</u> (6th century BC) speaks of the "shame" which it brought on Israel (<u>Jeremiah 48:13</u>). <u>Hosea 13:1–3</u> describes how the Israelites are abandoning <u>Adonai</u> for the worship of Baal, and accuses them of making or using images for 'idol' worship. Chief among these, it appears, was the image of the bull at Bethel, which by the time of Hosea was being worshipped as an image of Baal.

¹⁵ When the water was gone, she put the boy in the shade of a bush. ¹⁶ Then she went and sat down by herself about a hundred yards^[c] away. "I don't want to watch the boy die," she said, as she burst into tears. ¹⁷ But God heard the boy crying, and the angel of God called to Hagar from heaven, "Hagar, what's wrong? Do not be afraid! God has heard the boy crying as he lies there. ¹⁸ Go to him and comfort him, for I will make a great nation from his descendants."

²² About this time, Abimelech came with Phicol, his army commander, to visit Abraham. "God is obviously with you, helping you in everything you do," Abimelech said. ²³ "Swear to me in God's name that you will never deceive me, my children, or any of my descendants. I have been loyal to you, so now swear that you will be loyal to me and to this country where you are living as a foreigner."

³¹ Then he named the place Beersheba (which means "well of the oath"), because that was where they had sworn the oath. 32 After making their covenant at Beersheba, Abimelech left with Phicol, the commander of his army, and they returned home to the land of the Philistines.³³ Then Abraham planted a tamarisk tree at Beersheba, and there he worshiped the LORD, the Eternal God. ³⁴ And Abraham lived as a foreigner in Philistine country for a long time.

GILGAL

- **Joshua 4:20**
- It was there at **Gilgal** that Joshua piled up the twelve stones taken from the Jordan River.
- **Joshua 5:9**
- Then the LORD said to Joshua, "Today I have rolled away the shame of your slavery in Egypt." So that place has been called **Gilgal** to this day.

⁶ Come back to the LORD and live! Otherwise, he will roar through Israel like a fire, devouring you completely. Your gods in Bethel won't be able to quench the flames. ⁷ You twist justice, making it a bitter pill for the oppressed. You treat the righteous like dirt...

⁹ With blinding speed and power he destroys the strong, crushing all their defences.

10 How you hate honest judges! How you despise people who tell the truth! 11 You trample the poor, stealing their grain through taxes and unfair rent. Therefore, though you build beautiful stone houses, you will never live in them. Though you plant lush vineyards, you will never drink wine from them. 12 For I know the vast number of your sins and the depth of your rebellions. You oppress good people by taking bribes and deprive the poor of justice in the courts.

¹⁴ Do what is good and run from evil so that you may live!
Then the LORD God of Heaven's Armies will be your helper, just as you have claimed. ¹⁵ Hate evil and love what is good; turn your courts into true halls of justice.

Perhaps even yet the LORD God of Heaven's Armies will have mercy on the remnant of his people.

²¹ "I <u>hate</u> all your show and pretence—the hypocrisy of your religious festivals and solemn assemblies. ²² I will not accept your burnt offerings and grain offerings. I won't even notice all your choice peace offerings. ²³ Away with your noisy hymns of praise! I will not listen to the music of your harps.

²⁴ Instead, I want to see a mighty flood of justice, an endless river of righteous living.

Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need.


