Title: Walking in the Spirt II – overcoming fear

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Walking in the Spirit can be compared to walking on water. Every step is a miracle.

Living in the Spirit – place of rest + strength; outside of the Spirit – place of restlessness and heaviness.

#### Matthew 14:24-33 (NKJV)

<sup>24</sup> But the boat was now in the <u>middle</u> of the sea, <u>tossed</u> by the waves, for the wind was contrary.<sup>25</sup> Now in the fourth watch <u>of the night</u> Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. <sup>26</sup> And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "<u>It is a ghost!</u>" And they cried out <u>for fear</u>. <sup>27</sup> But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Be of good cheer! It is I; <u>do not be afraid</u>." <sup>28</sup> And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." <sup>29</sup> So He said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he <u>walked on the water</u> to go to Jesus. <sup>30</sup> But when <u>he saw</u> that the wind <u>was</u> boisterous, he <u>was afraid</u>; and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!" <sup>31</sup> And <u>immediately</u> Jesus stretched out *His* hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" <sup>32</sup> And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. <sup>33</sup> Then those who were in the boat came and <u>worshiped Him</u>, saying, "Truly You are the Son of God."

## 1. Fear affects our sight

Fear is a veil that <u>blinds</u>. Two sides: (1) Not seeing God (2) Superstitious – seeing things that aren't there.

- **View with suspicion** even God and the people around us. Exodus 16:3 "You have brought us out to kill us."
- Curse of fear:

### Deuteronomy 28:65-66 (NKJV)

<sup>65</sup> And among those nations you shall find <u>no rest</u>, nor shall the sole of your foot have a resting place; but there the LORD will give you <u>a trembling heart</u>, <u>failing eyes</u>, and <u>anguish of soul</u>. <sup>66</sup> Your life shall <u>hang in</u> doubt before you; you shall fear day and night, and have no assurance of life.

- Place of obedience = safe place (behind God); Disobey = unsafe place (moving out from behind God).
- **Fear paints false pictures** before the eyes of our hearts. **Fear's mission** is to steal our joy and so with that our strength for following God.
- "It's a ghost!" (1) Incapacitate unable to do the will of God (2) Torment cause pain and torture in our lives (3) Flee run away from God and the will of God.

# 2. The manifest presence of God gives us eyes of faith

- We are called to **see with the eyes of our hearts**, not our physical eyes.
- Fear pulls us out of the Spirit, faith puts us back into the Spirit.

Isaiah 6:1-3 (NKJV) <sup>1</sup> In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His *robe* filled the temple. <sup>2</sup> Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. <sup>3</sup> And one cried to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy *is* the LORD of hosts; The whole earth *is* full of His glory!"

- **Praise** building a "temple" or environment for Him to come and fill.
- Worship our hearts surrendered and overwhelmed by His goodness. Lord,

### Hebrews 10:35-39 (NLT)

<sup>35</sup> So do not throw away this <u>confident trust</u> in the Lord. Remember the <u>great reward</u> it brings you! <sup>36</sup> <u>Patient endurance</u> is what you need now, so that you will <u>continue to do God's will</u>. Then you will receive all that he has promised. <sup>37</sup> "For in just a little while, the Coming One will come and not delay. <sup>38</sup> And my <u>righteous</u>

ones will live by faith. But I will take no pleasure in anyone who turns away." <sup>39</sup> But we are not like those who turn away from God to their own destruction. We are the faithful ones, whose souls will be saved.

**Live by faith:** we don't live by our natural senses, but by our eternal senses. **L** In His presence – you will see opportunities.

Outside of His presence – we will become stressed and depressed...

## 3. Fear will keep us from stepping into the Spirit

Proverbs 29:25 (NLT) <sup>25</sup> Fearing people is a <u>dangerous trap</u>, but <u>trusting</u> the LORD means safety.

## 4. Fear neutralises the gift of God in our lives

Fear pulls us out of the Spirit, faith puts us back into the Spirit.

### The effectiveness of the gift of God - depends on my confidence in that gift for me here and now

What is the gift?— an ability / grace to do something.

Fear will cause the gift to become neutralised and so we will sink.

2 Timothy 1:6-7 (NLT) <sup>6</sup> This is why I remind you to fan into flames the spiritual gift God gave you when I laid my hands on you. <sup>7</sup> For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline.

Proclaim – the truth. Cancel the power of fear. Fear can only operate within the context of lies.

## 5. Fear (worry and anxiety) is never legitimate

### Why did you doubt?

Anxiety magnifies the waves. Faith diminishes the size of the waves.

Philippians 4:6-7 (NKJV) <sup>6</sup> Be anxious <u>for nothing</u>, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; <sup>7</sup> and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will <u>guard your</u> hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

### Conclusion:

Fear pulls us out of the Spirit, faith puts us back into the Spirit.

**Praise** – create an environment where God's manifest presence can dwell.

**Worship** – surrender your life and the challenges you face.

**Proclaim** – proclaim the truth of who God is.
