James 1:14&15 (NIV)

Each one is **tempted** when, by his own evil desire, he is dragged away and enticed. Then, after **desire has conceived**, it **gives birth to sin**; and sin, when it is full-grown **gives birth to death**.

Temptation

- Temptation is not sin.
- Temptation comes to us through our thoughts.

Contemplation

- We sin by giving ourselves permission to dwell on wrong thoughts and rationalise wrong choices.
- Ephesians 3:5 (NIV) "But among you there must not be even a <u>hint</u> of sexual immorality..."

Activation

- We act upon our thoughts in direct disobedience to God's commandments
- This stage leads to death and shame

How do we deal with temptation?

1. Flee

1 Corinthians 6:18 (NKJV)

Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body.

How do we deal with temptation?

2. Tell a friend

1 John 1:7 (NKJV)

But if we <u>walk in the light</u> as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another and the <u>blood of Jesus</u> Christ His Son <u>cleanses us</u> from all sin.

How do we deal with temptation?

3. Set Boundaries Matthew 5:29&30 (NKJV)

If your right eye causes you to sin, <u>pluck it</u> <u>out</u> and cast it from you... And if your right hand causes you to sin, <u>cut it off</u> and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for

you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be cast into hell.
