GLORY MIRROR

2 Corinthians 3:16–18 (NKJV) ¹⁶ Nevertheless when one turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. ¹⁷ Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, <u>there is liberty.</u>

GLORY MIRROR

¹⁸ But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are <u>being transformed into the same</u> <u>image</u> from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord.

TRUTH MIRROR – (1) WORD

2 Timothy 3:16–17 (NLT) ¹⁶ All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us <u>realize what</u> is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. ¹⁷ God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work.

TRUTH MIRROR – (2) SPIRIT

John 16:8 (NLT) ⁸ And when he comes, he will convict the world of its sin, and of God's righteousness, and of the coming judgment.

Proverbs 9:8 (NLT) ⁸ So **don't bother** correcting mockers; they will <u>only hate</u> <u>you</u>. But correct <u>the wise</u>, and they will love you.

WISE OR A FOOL?

Proverbs 9:10–12 (NLT) ¹⁰ Fear of the LORD is the foundation of wisdom. Knowledge of the Holy One results in good judgment. ¹¹ Wisdom will multiply your days and add years to your life. ¹² If you become wise, you will be the one to benefit. If you scorn wisdom, you will be the one to suffer.

WISE OR A FOOL?

Proverbs 15:31 (NLT) ³¹ *If you listen to constructive criticism, you will be at home among the wise.*

WISE OR A FOOL?

Proverbs 17:10 (The Message) ¹⁰ A quiet rebuke to a person of good sense does more than a whack on the head of a fool.

DISTORTED MIRROR

John 10:19–21 (NKJV) ¹⁹ Therefore there was a division again among the Jews because of these sayings. ²⁰ **And many of them said, "He has a demon and is mad. Why do you listen to Him?"** ²¹ Others said, "These are not the words of one who has a demon. Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?"

RECEIVING CORRECTION

Matthew 16:22–24 (NKJV) ²² Then Peter took Him aside and **began to rebuke Him**, saying, **"Far be it from You, Lord; this shall not happen to You!"** ²³ But He turned and said to Peter, **"Get behind Me**, **Satan! You are an offense to Me**, for you **are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of men."**

RECEIVING CORRECTION

²⁴ Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone desires to come after Me, <u>let him</u> <u>deny himself</u>, and take up his cross, and follow Me.

HOW TO RECEIVE FEEDBACK?

- 1. Onus is on the receiver, not the giver.
- 2. Look into the glory mirror, often.
- Invite feedback (1) What's one thing you particularly appreciate about me?
 (2) What's one thing you see me doing – or failing to do – that you think I should change?
- 4. Check feedback with trusted friends or family (if you're unsure).
