



GLORY MIRROR

2 Corinthians 3:16–18 (NKJV) ¹⁶ Nevertheless when one turns to the Lord, **the veil is taken away.** ¹⁷ Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

GLORY MIRROR

¹⁸ But we all, with unveiled face, **beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord.**

TRUTH MIRROR – (1) WORD

2 Timothy 3:16–17 (NLT) ¹⁶ All Scripture is inspired by God and is **useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right.** ¹⁷ God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work.

TRUTH MIRROR – (2) SPIRIT

John 16:8 (NLT) ⁸ And when he comes, he **will convict the world of its sin, and of God's righteousness, and of the coming judgment.**

WISE OR A FOOL?

Proverbs 9:8 (NLT) ⁸ So **don't bother correcting mockers; they will only hate you. But correct the wise, and they will love you.**

WISE OR A FOOL?

Proverbs 9:10–12 (NLT) ¹⁰ ***Fear of the LORD is the foundation of wisdom. Knowledge of the Holy One results in good judgment.*** ¹¹ *Wisdom will multiply your days and add years to your life.* ¹² *If you become wise, you will be the one to benefit. If you scorn wisdom, you will be the one to suffer.*

WISE OR A FOOL?

Proverbs 15:31 (NLT) ³¹ ***If you listen to constructive criticism, you will be at home among the wise.***

WISE OR A FOOL?

Proverbs 17:10 (The Message) ¹⁰ ***A quiet rebuke to a person of good sense does more than a whack on the head of a fool.***

DISTORTED MIRROR

John 10:19–21 (NKJV) ¹⁹ *Therefore there was a division again among the Jews because of these sayings.* ²⁰ ***And many of them said, "He has a demon and is mad. Why do you listen to Him?"*** ²¹ *Others said, "These are not the words of one who has a demon. Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?"*

RECEIVING CORRECTION

Matthew 16:22–24 (NKJV) ²² *Then Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "Far be it from You, Lord; this shall not happen to You!"* ²³ *But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are an offense to Me, for you are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of men."*

RECEIVING CORRECTION

²⁴ *Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me.*

HOW TO RECEIVE FEEDBACK?

1. Onus is on the receiver, not the giver.
2. Look into the glory mirror, often.
3. Invite feedback – (1) *What's **one thing** you particularly appreciate about me?*
(2) *What's **one thing** you see me doing – or failing to do – that you think I should change?*
4. Check feedback with trusted friends or family (if you're unsure).
