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<ul> <li>Desire to be more like Jesus</li> </ul>	
"Create in me a pure heart, O God, and	
renew a steadfast spirit within me.	
Do not cast me away from your	
presence or take your Holy Spirit from	
me."

<ul> <li>Repentant heart</li> <li>Desire to know Jesus more, to become more like him</li> <li>Allowing relationship to be what it was designed to be, part of which is facilitating this change / growth</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>KEY THREE: COUNT THE COST</li> <li>The principle of counting the cost</li> <li>When it's worth it, the cost normally pales in comparison to the reward</li> <li>A personal example</li> </ul>	
Luke 14:28-30 NIV  Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it?	

Luke 14:28-30 NIV (continued)  For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, saying, "This person began to build and wasn't able to finish."	
<ul> <li>KEY THREE: COUNT THE COST</li> <li>The cost pales in comparison to the reward</li> <li>A personal example</li> </ul>	
KEY FOUR: MAINTAIN CONNECTION DURING CONFLICT  It's okay to disagree about stuff Unity versus uniformity The goal of working through conflict, of discussing disagreements	

<ul> <li>KEY FIVE: ENGAGE WITH HONOUR</li> <li>Treating others according to their current state versus intended design</li> <li>The power of giving the benefit of the doubt</li> <li>Major killers: familiarity, competition &amp; entitlement</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Know your worth</li> <li>Be malleable</li> <li>Count the cost</li> <li>Maintain connection during conflict</li> <li>Engage with honour</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>HOW WE GROW IN THESE AREAS</li> <li>Behaviour modification versus a change in heart</li> <li>Jesus – <ul> <li>Our perfect example</li> <li>When we encounter relationship with Him, we are changed, and that changes how we do relationship</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	

#### THE GOLDEN THREAD

- Our sinful nature: the purpose of relationship is to somehow fill me
- Jesus' heart: the purpose of relationship is to empty myself for you (Philippians 2)
