
(Jon 3:9) Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish."






# Isreals Military and Economical Victories




1. What is a double heart?

(Mat 6:24) "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.






## 3. How to heal a double heart
