Rejection can be defined as the sense of being unwanted. You desire people to love you, yet you believe that they do not. You want to be part of a group, but you feel excluded. Somehow you are always on the outside looking in. – Derek Prince

The causes of rejection

All relationships have the risk of rejection. Deepest wound that humans can experience.

- 1. Deepest wound is as a child
- 2. By others not chosen
- 3. Our circumstance lost, sickness, poverty

Rejection leads to betrayal & shame

Isaiah 54:6-8 (NIV)

⁶ The Lord will call you back as if you were a wife deserted and distressed in spirit— a wife who married young, only to be rejected," says your God. ⁷ "For a brief moment I abandoned you, but with deep compassion I will bring you back. ⁸ In a surge of anger I hid my face from you for a moment, but with everlasting kindness I will have compassion on you," says the Lord your Redeemer.

How we deal with rejection

1 John 4:18-19

¹⁸ There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love. ¹⁹ We love because he first loved us.

How we deal with rejection

- 1. Person gives in
 - Rejection
 - Loneliness
 - Self-pity
 - Misery
 - Depression
 - Despair or hopelessness
 - Death or suicide
- 2. Person holds out
- 3. Person fights back

Jesus was rejected for us

Luke 23:18-21

¹⁸ But they all cried out together, "Away with this man, and release to us Barabbas"—

¹⁹ a man who had been thrown into prison for an insurrection started in the city and for murder.

²⁰ Pilate addressed them once more, desiring to release Jesus, ²¹ but they kept shouting, "Crucify, crucify him!"

Look to Jesus for acceptance & healing

Hebrews 12:2-3

³ Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted.

Accept that we are chosen

Ephesians 1:3-6

Our healing is in God and not in people

Zephaniah 3:17-20

¹⁷ The LORD your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing. ¹⁸ I will gather those of you who mourn for the festival, so that you will no longer suffer reproach.

¹⁹ Behold, at that time I will deal with all your oppressors. - 3. Renounce the destructive fruits of rejection
- 4. Accept that I am accepted because Jesus was rejected.
- 5. Accept yourself
- 6. Find acceptance in God's family
