#### How are we supposed to treat strangers?

**Leviticus** 19:33-34 33 "When a <u>stranger</u> sojourns with you in your land, you shall not do him wrong. 34 You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and <u>you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers</u> in the land of Egypt: I am the LORD your God.

## Show hospitality to strangers

**Hebrews 13:1-3** <sup>1</sup>Let brotherly love continue. <sup>2</sup> Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares.

### We will be rewarded for our deeds

Matthew 25:31-34 <sup>31</sup> "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. <sup>32</sup> Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. <sup>33</sup> And he will place the sheep on his right, but the goats on the left. <sup>34</sup> Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.

## Jesus wants us to do things for Him?

Matthew 25:35-36 <sup>35</sup> For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.'

# How do we do these things for Him?

Matthew 25:37-39 <sup>37</sup> Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? <sup>38</sup> And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? <sup>39</sup> And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?'

#### We must do it for our brothers

Matthew 25:40 And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, <u>as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.</u>

#### For we are saved by grace

**Ephesians 2:8-10** § For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, 9 not a result of works, so that no one may boast. 10 For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them

### Remember that once we were strangers

**Ephesians 2:11-12**<sup>11</sup> Therefore remember that at one time you Gentiles in the flesh, called "the uncircumcision" by what is called the circumcision, which is made in the flesh by hands—<sup>12</sup> remember that you were at that time <u>separated from Christ</u>, <u>alienated</u> from the commonwealth of Israel <u>and strangers to the covenants of promise</u>, <u>having no hope</u> and <u>without God</u> in the world

### Jesus died so that we will never be strangers again

Ephesians 2:13-17 <sup>13</sup> But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. <sup>14</sup> For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility <sup>15</sup> by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, <sup>16</sup> and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility. <sup>17</sup> And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near.

#### We can prevent seekers to meet Jesus

**Luke 19:2-3** <sup>2</sup> And behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus. He was a chief tax collector and was rich. <sup>3</sup> And he was <u>seeking</u> to see who Jesus was, <u>but on account of the crowd he could not</u>, because he was small in stature.

#### Jesus has a heart for the seekers

Luke 19:4-5 <sup>4</sup> So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him, for he was about to pass that way. <sup>5</sup> And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today."

## **Encounters with Jesus makes us joyful**

**Luke 19:6-7** 6 So he hurried and came down and received him joyfully. 7 And when they saw it, they all grumbled, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner."

## Jesus convicts people to do right thing

**Luke 19:8-9** 8 And Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor. And if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold." 9 And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham

#### Jesus' heart is for the lost

Luke 19:10<sup>10</sup> For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.

**John 3:17** For God <u>did not send</u> his Son into the world <u>to condemn</u> the world, but in order that <u>the world might be saved through him</u>

#### But Jesus goes after those who are lost

Luke 15:3-4 <sup>3</sup> o he told them this parable: <sup>4</sup> "What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it?

## Jesus rejoices over the stranger

**Luke 15:5-7** <sup>5</sup> And when he has <u>found it</u>, he lays it on his shoulders, <u>rejoicing</u>. <sup>6</sup> And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, <u>'Rejoice with me</u>, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' <sup>7</sup> Just so, I tell you, <u>there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents</u> than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

#### When we become strangers in our own groups

John 20:26-31 <sup>26</sup> .... Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." <sup>27</sup> Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." <sup>28</sup> Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" <sup>29</sup> Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed

John 21:12-15 <sup>12</sup> Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. <sup>13</sup> Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. <sup>14</sup> This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead. <sup>15</sup> When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs."

# **G**od loves the stranger

**Deuteronomy 10:18-19** <sup>18</sup> He administers justice for the fatherless and the widow, and loves the stranger, giving him food and clothing. <sup>19</sup> Therefore love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt.

Matthew 11:28 Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.
