*The devil specializes in getting us to remember the wrong things, and forgetting the right things.*





We serve a God who remembers and forgets




God does not remember our sins.

The accuser of the brethren (Revelation 12:10) uses memories to push us away from God, into shame and guilt and into hiding from God and hiding from one another.






The Holy Spirit invites us to deeper intimacy based upon the blood of Jesus.


“Come now, and let us reason together, says the Lord. “Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white a snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall be as wool.”
