be hospitable

HOSPITAL'ITY, n. [L. hospitalitas.] The act or practice of receiving and entertaining strangers or guests without reward, or with kind and generous liberality.

Hospitality, philoxenos. To entertain strangers, be fond of guests, given to (lover of) hospitality. From the root word philos, meaning a friend or neighbor; fondly, friendly.

ii. Strangers (Temporary Resident)

leviticus 19:34

34 You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt: I am the LORD your God.

deuteronomy 10:18-19
