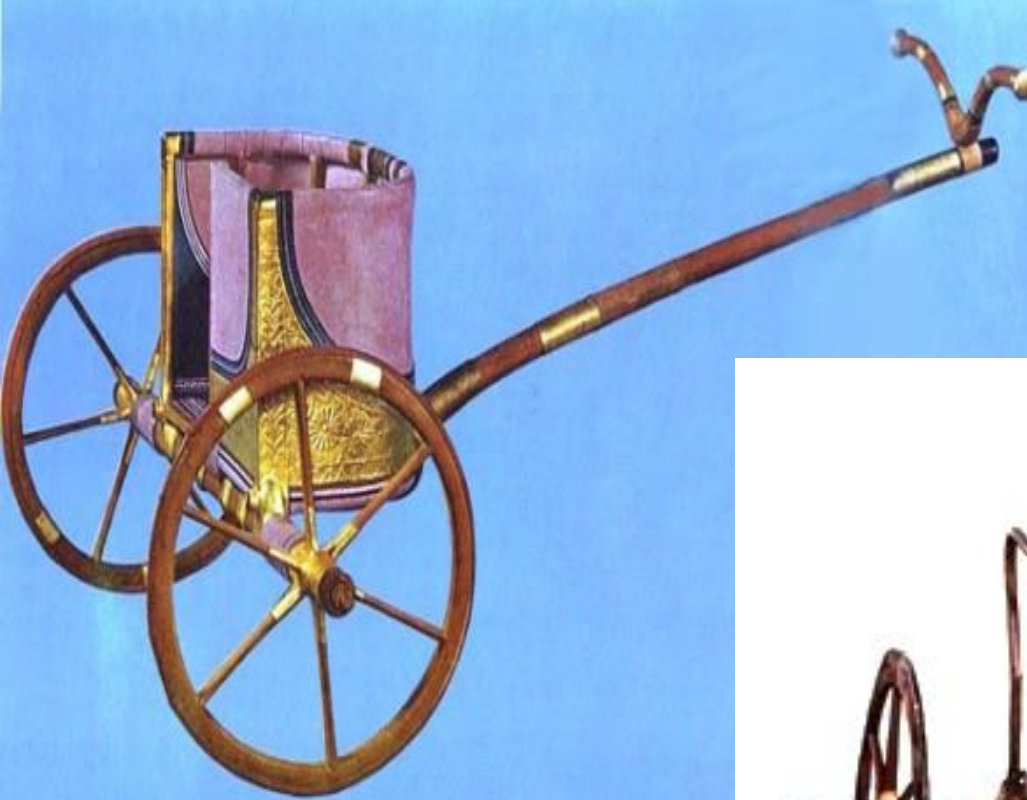






Exodus 14: 6, 9,13,14,28

<sup>6</sup> So he made ready his chariot and took his people with him. Also, he took six hundred choice chariots, and all the chariots of Egypt with captains over every one of them. <sup>9</sup> So the Egyptians pursued them, all the horses and chariots of Pharaoh, his horsemen and his army, and overtook them camping by the sea beside Pi Hahiroth, before Baal Zephon.





**<sup>13</sup> And Moses said to the people, “Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the LORD, which He will accomplish for you today. But deliverance and victory belong to the LORD.






Job 39: 19, 25 (NKJV)

## 1 Kings 10:24\_26 (NKJV)

<sup>24</sup> Now all the earth sought the presence of Solomon to hear his wisdom, which God had put in his heart. <sup>25</sup> Each man brought his present: articles of silver and gold, garments, armor, spices, horses, and mules, at a set rate year by year. <sup>26</sup> And Solomon gathered chariots and horsemen; he had one thousand four hundred chariots and twelve thousand horsemen, whom he stationed in the chariot cities and with the king at Jerusalem.



## 2 Kings 23: 11 (NKJV)

<sup>11</sup> Then he removed the horses that the kings of Judah had dedicated to the sun, at the entrance to the house of the LORD, by the chamber of Nathan-Melech, the officer who was in the court; and he burned the chariots of the sun with fire.







2 Kings 2:11 (NKJV)

<sup>11</sup> Then it happened, as they continued on and talked, that suddenly a chariot of fire appeared with horses of fire, and separated the two of them; and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.



## 2 Kings 6:14 - 17 (NKJV)

<sup>14</sup> Therefore he sent horses and chariots and a great army there, and they came by night and surrounded the city. <sup>15</sup> And when the servant of the man of God arose early and went out, there was an army, surrounding the city with horses and chariots. And his servant said to him, "Alas, my master! What shall we do?"



<sup>16</sup> But he shall not multiply horses for himself, nor cause the people to return to Egypt to multiply horses, for the LORD has said to you, 'You shall not return that way again.' <sup>17</sup> Neither shall he multiply wives for himself, lest his heart turn away; nor shall he greatly multiply silver and gold for himself.
