2 Timothy 1:3-7 (NKJV) <sup>3</sup> I thank God, whom I serve with a pure conscience, as my forefathers did, as without ceasing I remember you in my prayers night and day, <sup>4</sup> greatly desiring to see you, being mindful of your tears, that I may be filled with joy,

2 Timothy 1:3-7 (NKJV) <sup>5</sup> when I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also. <sup>6</sup> Therefore I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands.

2 Timothy 3:16,17 – 4:5 (NKJV) <sup>1</sup>I charge you therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ, who will judge the living and the dead at His appearing and His kingdom: <sup>2</sup> Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching.

2 Timothy 3:16,17 – 4:5 (NKJV) <sup>3</sup> For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; <sup>4</sup> and they will turn their ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables.

2 Timothy 3:16,17 – 4:5 (NKJV) <sup>5</sup> But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.

-preaching as speaking forcefully, having a ready command of scripture, making application and using illustrations, and then encouraging people to follow biblical concepts. - teaching means presenting a passage of scripture, commenting upon it, and making explanations to make the meaning of the biblical passage clear.
