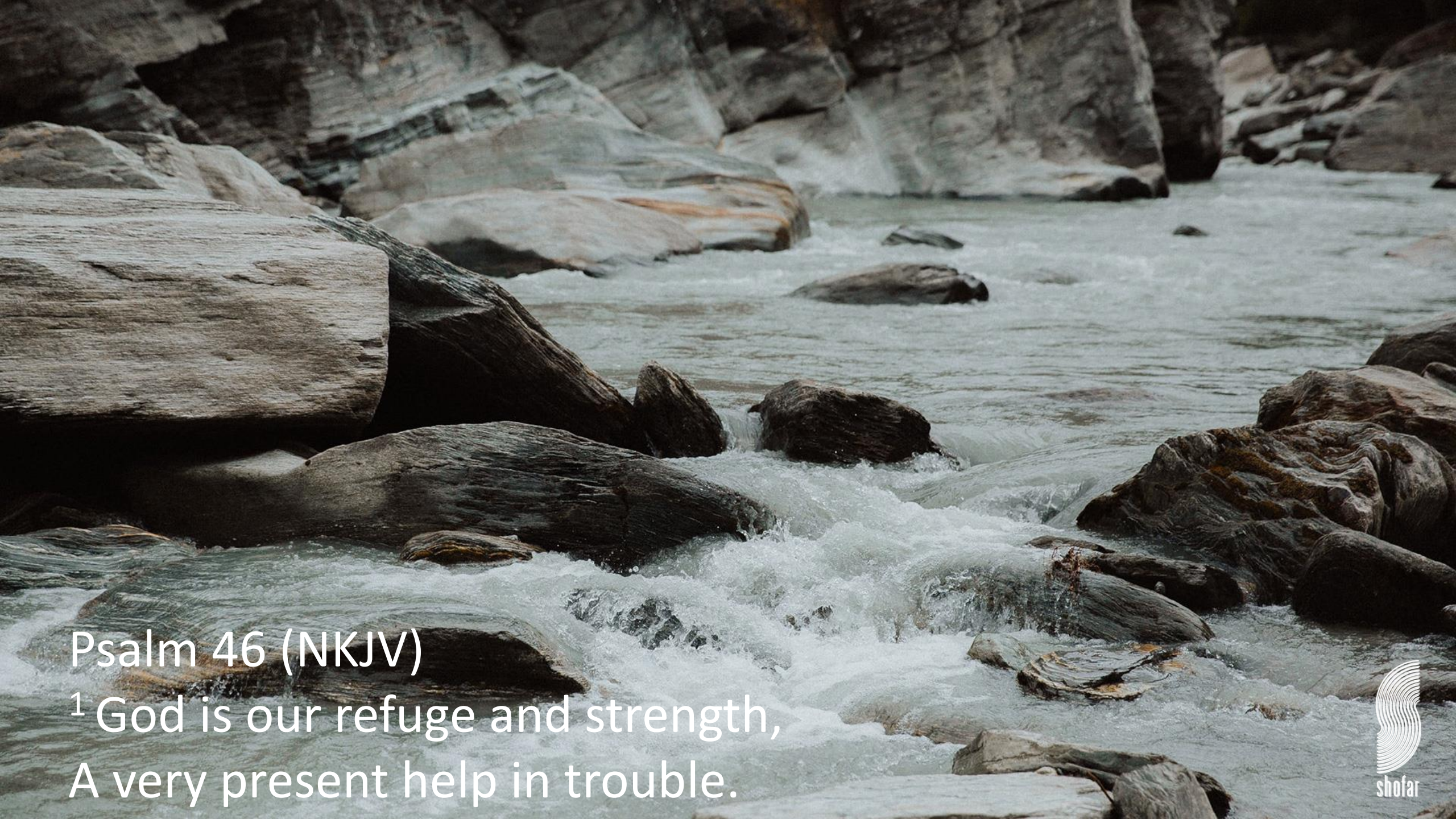







¹ God is our refuge and strength,

The holy place of the tabernacle of the Most High.




⁵ God is in the midst of her, she shall not be moved;






