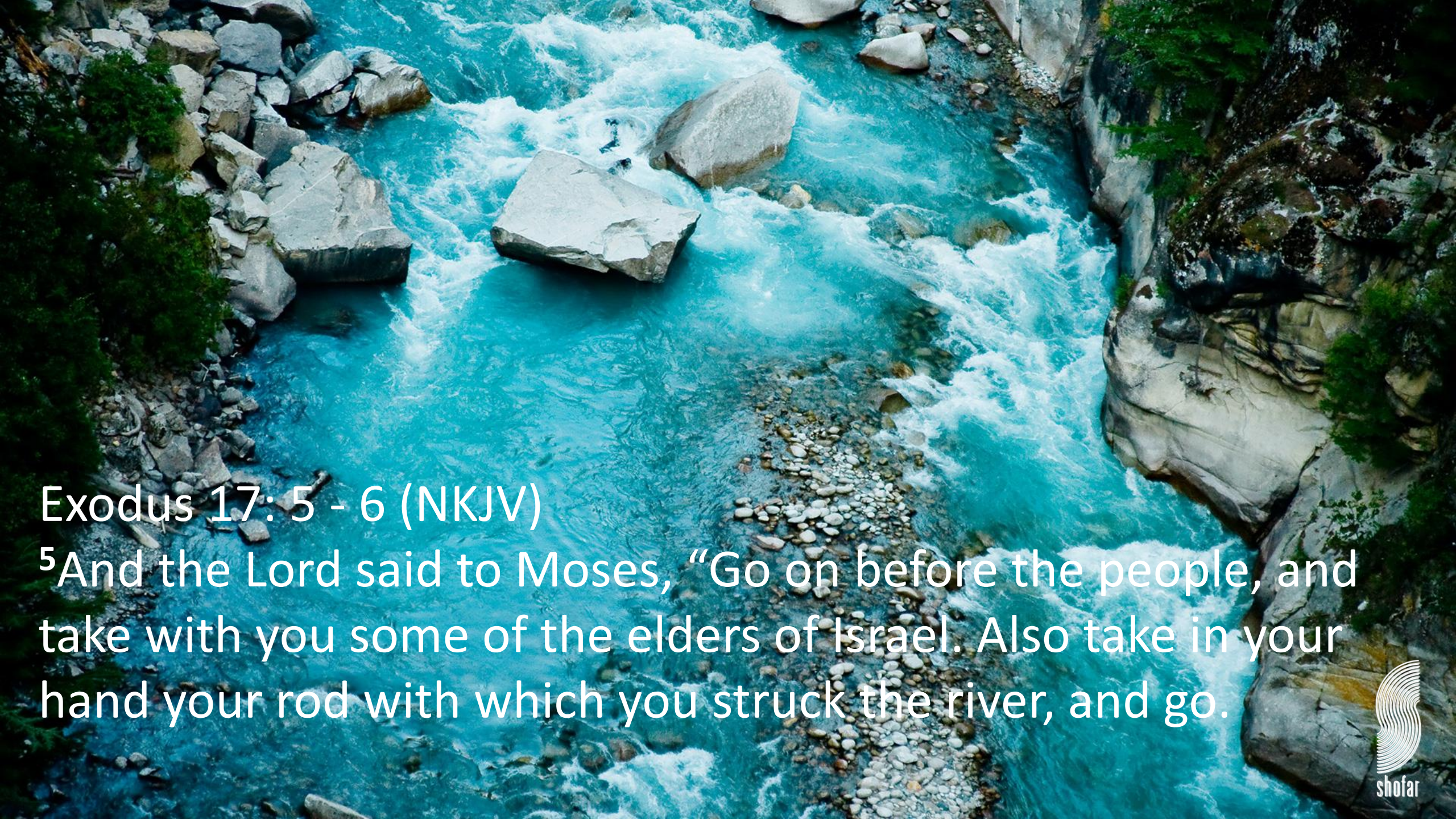

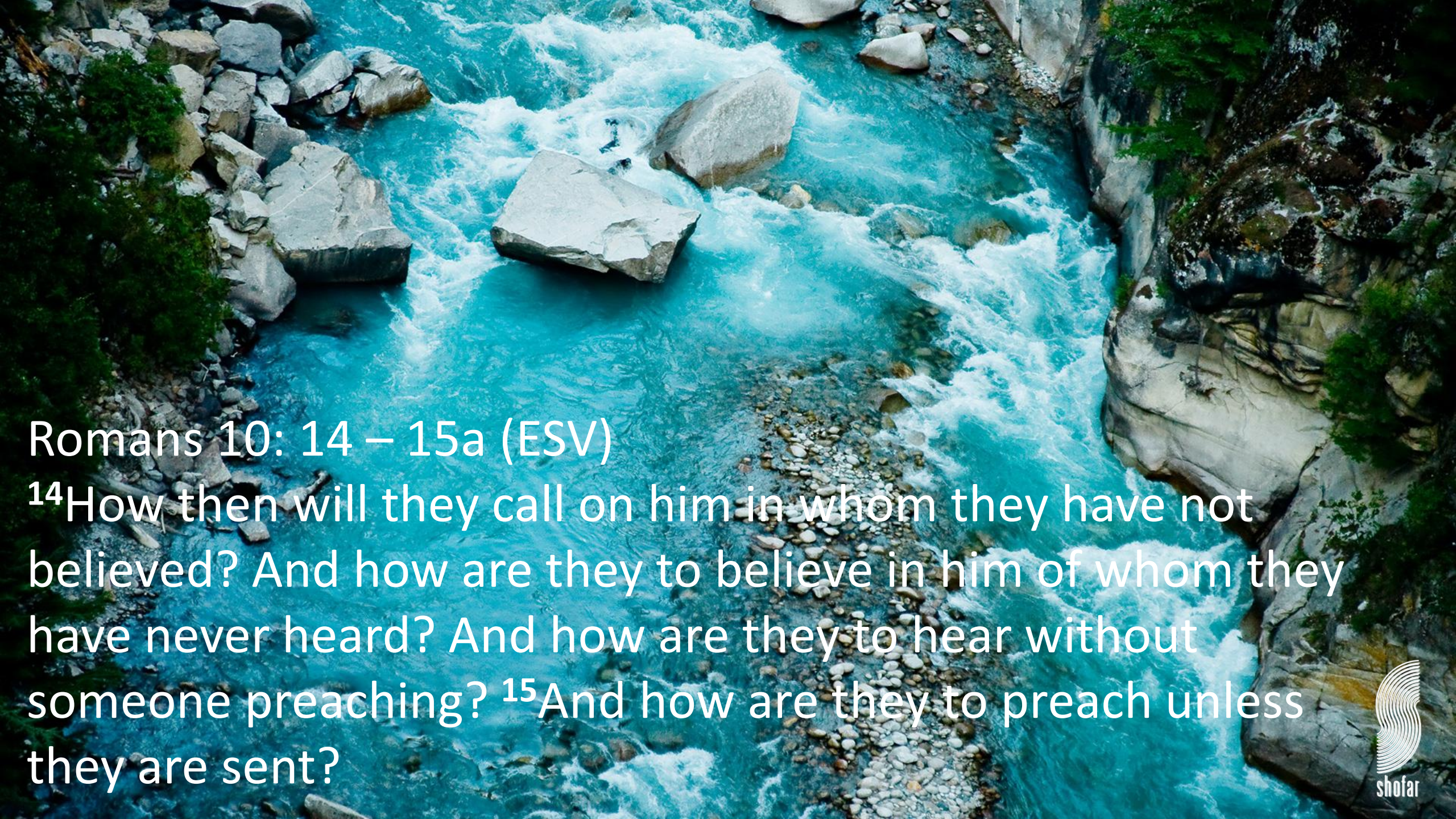

that the people may drink.”

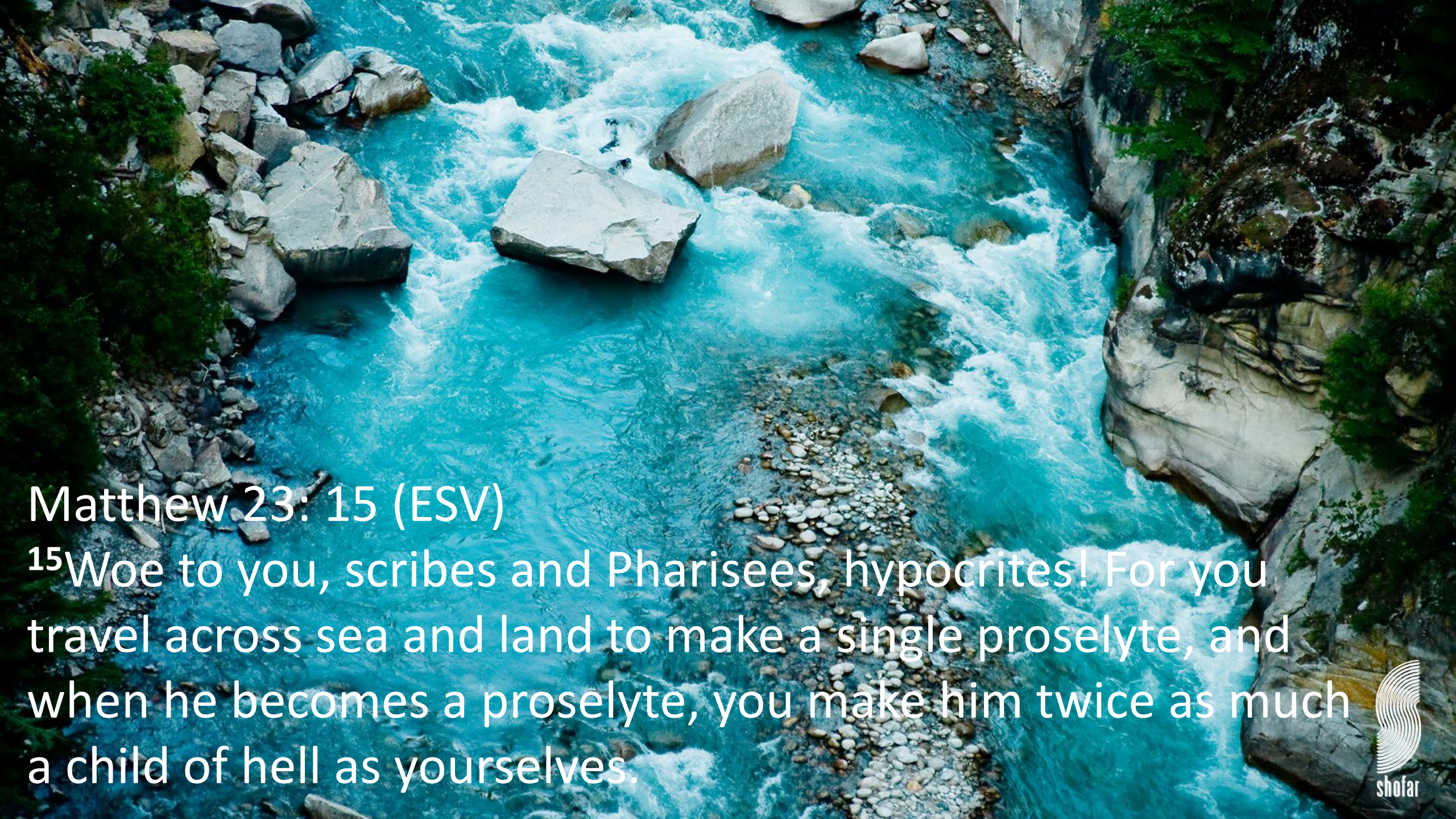

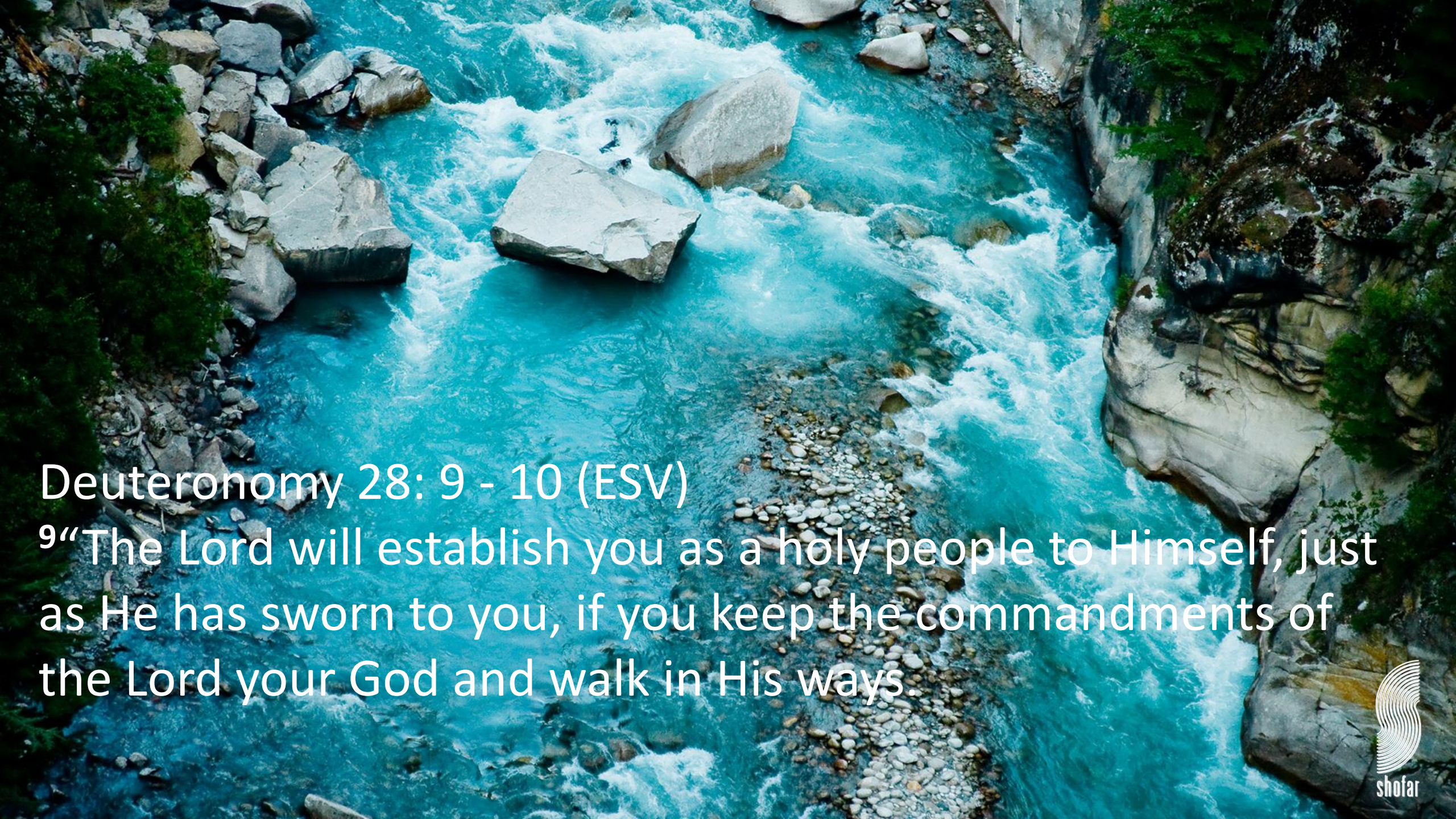


