








Proverbs 3: 5 (ESV)

⁸Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us. Selah




Trusting GOD is the key to peace and rest in this life

¹² There are certain Jews whom you have appointed over the affairs of the province of Babylon: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. These men, O king, pay no attention to you; they do not serve your gods or worship the golden image that you have set up.”

¹³ Then Nebuchadnezzar in furious rage commanded that Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego be brought. So they brought these men before the king.

¹⁴ Nebuchadnezzar answered and said to them, “Is it true, O Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, that you do not serve my gods or worship the golden image that I have set up?”

¹⁵ Now if you are ready when you hear the sound of the horn, pipe, lyre, trigon, harp, bagpipe, and every kind of music, to fall down and worship the image that I have made, well and good...

¹⁵ ...But if you do not worship, you shall immediately be cast into a burning fiery furnace. And who is the god who will deliver you out of my hands?”

¹⁶Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego answered and said to the king, “O Nebuchadnezzar, we have no need to answer you in this matter.

¹⁷ If this be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of your hand, O king.




Daniel 3: 12 – 18 (ESV)

Luke 1 : 5 – 7 (ESV)






Psalm 51: 1 – 4 (ESV)


Exodus 2: 23 – 25 (ESV)

²³ During those many days the king of Egypt died, and the people of Israel groaned because of their slavery and cried out for help. Their cry for rescue from slavery came up to God.




Exodus 2: 23 – 25 (ESV)


Psalm 13: 1 – 6 (ESV)




Isaiah 40: 31 (ESV)
