Sanctification: to make holy, to consecrate and to separate from the ungodly patterns and practices of the world.



In practical terms, sanctification involves an ongoing process of spiritual growth, development and maturity by which God refines us spiritually, prepares us for His purpose and involves us in His plans.



- Believer maintain close personal relationship with Christ.
- Participate in fellowship with other Christians.
- Devote themselves to prayer.
- Obey God's Word.
- Be sensitive to God's presence and care.



- Love what is right and hate what is wicked and wrong.
- Put sin to death.
- Submit to God's discipline.
- Continue to obey and be filled with and empowered by the Holy Spirit.


<sup>14</sup> Pursue peace with all people, and holiness, without which no one will see the Lord:
